Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1) Describe a time when you were maligned. What were you trying to do and how was it interpreted? How did this experience impact you?
- 2) Jesus frequently hid or downplayed his identity as the coming Messiah. (See Matthew 16:20; Mark 5:43, 9:8; and John 6:15) How does this entry into Jerusalem make his identity even more obvious? (See Zechariah 9:9; and Psalm 118:25-27)
- 3) As you read through the things people said about Jesus at his trial (See Luke 23:1-25) and on the cross (See Luke 23:35-39), how do you think Jesus must have felt?
- 4) When we are wounded by being maligned for doing good, how do we keep from giving up? (See Hebrews 6:10-12)
