REALife Application

- 3. If God decided to just give everyone a "free pass", what would that say about His goodness? How does the cross demonstrate both God's goodness and His grace?
- 4. Why is the message of Jesus' substitutionary death and miraculous resurrection called the Gospel, which means "good news"? Who do you know that needs to hear the "good news"?
