

*Identity: Consumer or Christ Follower Ephesians 2:1-10 Definition of Margin: The space between my current activity and my limits.

Consumers see the world as a resource to <u>satisfy</u> their desires.

Christ followers see the world as the <u>stage</u> to <u>show off</u> Christ.
