Who is Blessed?

- 1) A person who rejects the <u>pull</u> of the <u>godless</u>. (v.1)
- 2) A person who <u>pursues</u> a daily commitment to <u>apply</u> God's ways. (v.2)

The Green (v.3) vs. The Brown (v.4)

-Planted (Permanent) -Wind Blown

-Fruitful (Productive) -Chaff

-Leafy (<u>Renewed</u>) -Lifeless

-Prosper (<u>Successful</u>) -Blows Away

Application:

- 1) The godless life may provide <u>temporary</u> pleasure but will result in <u>long term</u> pain. (v.5)
- 2) Follow God's path and enjoy His presence. (v.6)
