The Power of Words:

Two <u>Kinds</u> of Words 18:20-21 Words <u>Change</u> Things 12:18; 25:15

The Mocker's Words of Death:

The <u>Liar</u> 12:22; 6:16-19 The <u>Gossip</u> 16:28; 18:8; 26:20 The <u>Flatterer</u> 26:23-28; 29:5

The Noble Encourager's Words of Life:

The <u>Truth Teller</u> 15:2; 24:26 The <u>Peacemaker</u> 15:1, 4 The <u>Builder</u> 12: 25; 16:24

Application:

- 1) We all possess the power of words, so guard your tongue.
- 2) <u>Choose</u> the path of the Noble Encourager through the power of <u>God's Spirit</u>.

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REALife Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or REALife Group.

- 1) Why are words so important? What is the role of communication in our relationship with God and others? See John 1:1-18; James 3:1-12.
- Describe a time when someone's words demoralized you. When they empowered you? Generally speaking, how would you characterize your words to others? E.g. analytical, humorous, sarcastic, encouraging, etc.
- 3) Why are words better when used in small quantities? See Proverbs 10:19; 11:12; 13:3; 15:28; 17:28; 21:23. How does this differ from the "culture of self-expression" that we live in today?
- 4) What are some steps we can take to guard our lips and become a Noble Encourager? See Psalm 141:3. How can we teach these principles to the next generation?
