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My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1) When you study the way Jesus related to people, how is His treatment of the woman consistent with others? See John 5:1-14; Luke 19:2-9.
- 2) Was the woman in this situation guilty? What is so deceptive about sin that we feel we can get away without consequences? See James 1:13-15.
- 3) The religious leaders are guilty of breaking the very law they love. Have you ever been trapped this way? Why is legalism so subtle?
- 4) In the last thing Jesus said to the woman, what do you suppose was the tone in His voice? Guilt, warning, affirmation, understanding?
