# My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 2) Where does the ability to enjoy life come from? (See 5:18-20) Why would God give it to some and not to others? Do you think Solomon had it? Do you?
- 3) In what way is a stillborn baby better than a person without satisfaction? Should we expect life to be depressing at times? Is it a sin to go through down times? (See Job 3:11-26)
- 4) How can we find true satisfaction in this life? How much can we expect in this life as compared with the life to come? (See 2 Corinthians 4:7-12,16-18)
