



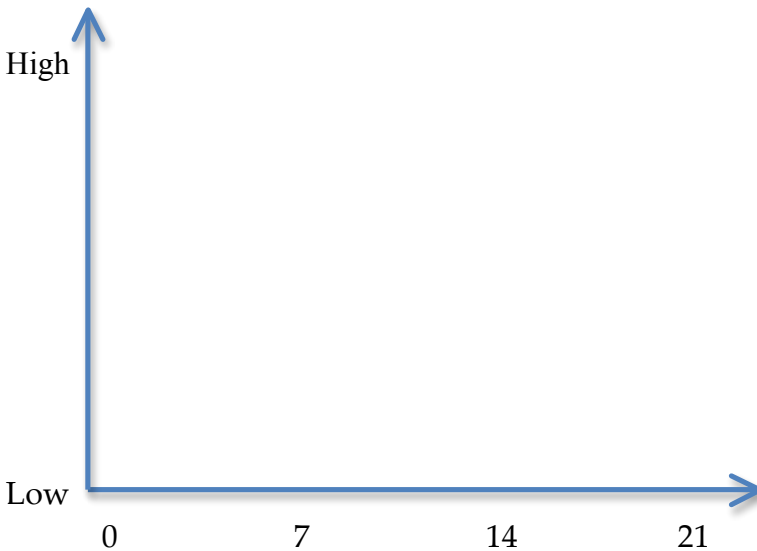

My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1) Read the following passages: Hebrews 4:12; Psalm 33:4; 119:160; John 17:17b. What do these passages say about God's Word?
- 2) Is it possible that the rigors of daily life seem to leave little time for personal or family time studying God's Word? Read verses 7-10 of Psalm 19 again and summarize in your own words the importance of spending daily time in God's Word.
- 3) At the end of Psalm 19, David calls God his "Rock and Redeemer." It is clear that David has seen and experienced the benefits of God's Word in his life. What are some of the benefits you and your family have received from studying God's Word? Make a list and take a moment to praise God for those benefits.
- 4) Did you take the three-week challenge to memorize the verse for each week of this series? If so, how is it going? Stay with it. Keep in mind the rewards of God's Word. Remember to post your family's video on the Hill Country Bible Church Facebook page.
