

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1. Make a list of your Core Values. What are those things that drive and influence your behavior? Think about your list. Do the beliefs and ideas that you wrote down correspond to your attitudes and behaviors? Are they really values if they are not seen in your actions?
- 2. We acknowledge that God is at work all around us, even in the small and seemingly insignificant. What are some of those incidental times in your life that you can reflect on the goodness of God? What are some ways that Jesus used the incidental things in life to teach the people who followed Him?
- 3. Since impression points can be crafted intentionally, what are some impression points you can craft for you and your family to talk about God and His Word? What are some traditions you already have that you can use to craft intentional impression points?
