My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1. Read 1 Corinthians 13:1-8. Restate the passage in your own words.
- 2. Compare the list given in 1 Corinthians 13:1-8 and the list of the fruit of the Spirit given in Galatians 5:22-26. What can we learn about love and life in the Spirit as Christians?
- 3. Matthew 5:38-43 and John 13:34 commands us to love. What does this command tell us about how we should love? What do they show us about God's love? Would God command us to do something we cannot control?
- 4. Ephesians 5:22-33 is the classic passage on marriage. Read verse 21. How do 1 Corinthians 13 and this passage relate to each?
