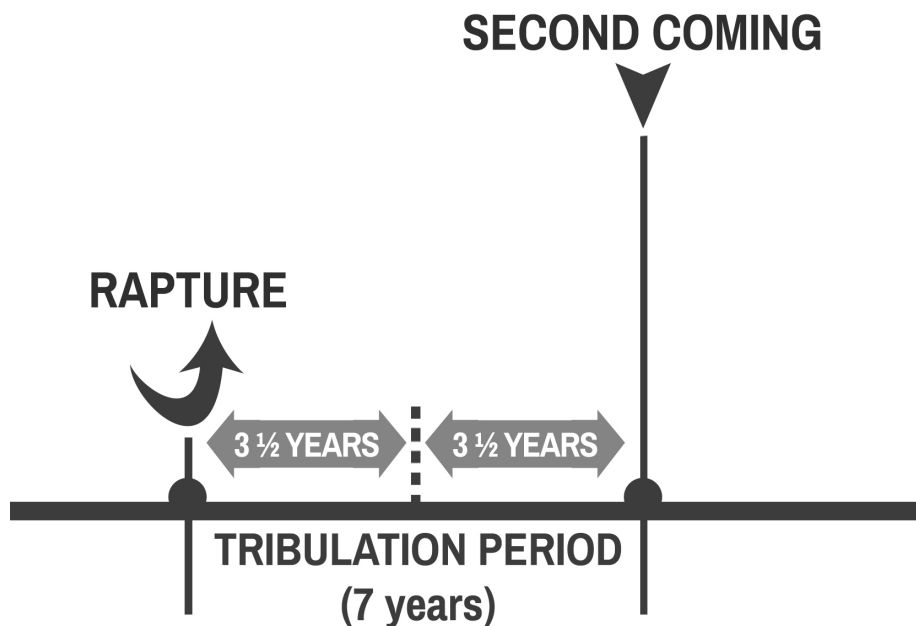

My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

1. Re-read 2 Thessalonians 2:3-12. Verse 3 says, “Don’t let anyone deceive you.” This implies that we have a choice about whether we are deceived. Why would anyone allow themselves to be deceived about something?
2. Give an example of a deception people believe because they prefer it to be the truth. Practically speaking, how can you tell when you are being deceived? What can you do about it?
3. Revelation 7:9-17 describes those who will be martyred during the tribulation. Hebrews 11:38 says the world is “not worthy” of such people. How does their example inspire or motivate you? Are you dedicated to live worthy of Jesus? What does that look like?
4. Are you helping people around you avoid the tribulation? If so, how? If not, what holds you back?
