Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1. Read Matthew 11:16-19. To what did Jesus compare His generation? In what way does that description apply to *our* generation? How have we been shaped by the information age?
- 2. In what ways can the instant access to information become a burden? Read Matthew 11:28-30. What does Jesus offer in exchange for our burdens? If Jesus "doesn't shout for our attention" how can we hear from Him?
