My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

1. Read 2 Corinthians 5:11-21. What things does Paul say motivate him? What is he motivated to do?
2. The word “reconciled” is repeated several times in this passage. What does this word mean and how is it different from “justification”?
3. Have you been reconciled to God? If so, what does it mean to you?
4. Those who have been reconciled to God are therefore His ambassadors. What are the responsibilities of an ambassador? How might an ambassador be motivated by fear or love to carry out those responsibilities?
5. Who are the people to whom God has sent you as ambassador? What is His appeal to them, and what are you doing to communicate it?
