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My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1) What are some examples of "unintentional sin?" See Leviticus 5:1-6. Why would God consider these acts as sinful? How do you define sin? How does the Bible define it?
- 2) Have you ever done something you knew was wrong and offensive to God, and wished there was a way to fix it? How did the sin offering provide a real opportunity to get things right?
- 3) Read through the actual process of the offering and imagine yourself as the sinner. See Leviticus 4:27-31 and 5:5. What grabs your attention?
- 4) The sacrificial system has ceased because Jesus is the perfect sacrifice. See Hebrews 10:10-14. When you are tempted to sin, do you think of His suffering to motivate you away from the temptation? Explain.
