My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1. God chose to announce the birth of Jesus to the lowly shepherds. He chose the place of his birth with farm animals. What does this show us about our God?
- 2. Examine the passage of John 1:11-12. What is the hope and the warning here? Have you truly received the salvation given through Jesus.
- 3. What gives you joy this Christmas? What distracts you from meditating on the miracle of the incarnation?
- 4. What does this story teach us about "witnessing?" Who is God prompting you to share your faith with this Christmas?
