Grow

- Name barriers and/or fears that keep you from engaging with people who follow different religions? If there is a distrust, identify where you think that may stem from.
- What's your mentality when encountering those who don't believe in Jesus? How does this affect how you approach or interact with them?
- Read Ecclesiastes 3:9-11. Discuss the meaning of the verse that reads "He has also set eternity in the hearts of men."
- When have you experienced something "beautiful" for a time, only to be left with the longing that sets in after it fades? (i.e. an achievement, a meal, relationship, a season in life, etc.). And have you ever considered this universal longing to be a starting point for spiritual conversations with your neighbors?
- Understanding the appeals of other religions helps us understand the people who
 adhere to them more. What is attractive to you about the motivations of other religions

 the justice of Islam, the enduring meaning of Buddhism, the unique & special identity
 of Judaism, the utopian promise of secular humanism, the independence of atheism?

- Who in your neighborhood will you start to ask these questions to this week: Why is what you believe meaningful to you? What about it is satisfying for you? How does it help you deal with the complexities of life?
- What other questions can you think of to get to know your neighbors at a deeper level?
