My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1. Read the description of the angel in 10:1-7. What is the significance of standing with one foot on the sea and one foot on land? Compare this with 11:15.
- 2. John is told to eat the little scroll. Why? Why is it sweet tasting in his mouth and sour in his stomach? How would you apply this passage in your life today?
- 3. Who are the two prophets in chapter 11? See Zech. 4:2-3, 11-14; Mal. 4:5; 2 Kings 1:10-14; 1 Kings 17:1; Deut. 18:15, 18:18; Ex. 7:14-11:10, along with Rev. 11:4-6.
- 4. What are the two reactions to the death of the prophets? How does this compare to people's reaction to Jesus' death and resurrection? What does this teach you about being a faithful witness?
