- 2. Read Jonah 4: 1-4. What stands out to you in the dialog with God? In what way is Jonah reluctant to let God be God?
- 3. Read Jonah 4: 5-10. How did God use the vine to reveal Jonah's true issue? What is your vine?
- 4. God makes it clear that He loves lost people. See Luke 15 and 2 Peter 3:9. Do you see people the way God does? Who are you sharing the gospel with this week?
