My Application

Use the following questions this week to reflect on what it would mean to align yourself with the truths taught in Scripture. Each question is meant for both personal reflection and as a catalyst for discussion with your family, friends, or small group.

- 1) What does Paul mean by “apart from the law” righteousness has been made known? How does the death of Christ demonstrate the righteousness of God?
- 2) Do you feel like God punishes you because you mess up? What does the atonement mean for your own sin?
- 3) How do we move from being consumed with ourselves to being consumed with God as we read the Bible? What practical steps could be taken to make this a reality?
- 4) As a follower of Jesus, when and how have you gotten distracted from following Him to where you actually lose heart? Read Hebrews 12:3 in light of what we looked at in Romans 3:21-31. How do these passages help us to press on and not lose heart?
